Title: Projects without Pain

Abstract

Project work has been shown to be an effective way of incorporating a variety of skills and systems all in the same activity. At the same time, a project can provide motivation through student-centered personalisation – all at a variety of different levels. Some of us, however, worry that ‘letting students off the leash’ in this way can mean losing control of the class. This highly practical session will aim to deal with this, along with other concerns we might have when it comes to managing projects. Among other things, we will look at:

- what we mean by a project;
- what can be good about using projects;
- how to manage and follow up a project in class;
- where to find suitable material for project work;
- and finally, ways of overcoming potential difficulties when using projects.

Title: Flipped IDEAS Classroom: Individual Differentiated Encompassing Autonomous Successful Learning.

Abstract

No two learners are alike. Each has different needs, goals, interests, learning styles but also constraints. The ‘one size fits all’ approach rarely if ever works in the 21st century learning environment. Accommodating such variety can present a huge challenge for teachers. This session will investigate what we mean by a Flipped Classroom and how it can help to deal with these issues. We will look at how it can open up opportunities for success for all learners whatever their characteristics without the need for a massive amount of additional work on the part of the teacher.
